

### 1 Kings 17:1-6

Now Elijah the Tishbite, from Tishbe in Gilead, said to Ahab, "As the LORD, the God of Israel, lives, whom I serve, there will be neither dew nor rain in the next few years except at my word."

<sup>2</sup> Then the word of the LORD came to Elijah: <sup>3</sup> "Leave here, turn eastward and hide in the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan. <sup>4</sup> You will drink from the brook, and I have directed the ravens to supply you with food there."

<sup>5</sup> So he did what the LORD had told him. He went to the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan, and stayed there. <sup>6</sup> The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and bread and meat in the evening, and he drank from the brook.

# THE WILDERNESS PATTERN // April 14, 2024

- 1. Read 1 Kings 17:1. On the one hand, *Elijah's a "nobody"*: we've heard nothing about him and we know nothing about Tishbe. On the other hand, *he's received this grand calling from God*: He will show that the Lord lives through stopping rain for multiple years. What do you resonate with more: feeling like a "nobody" or holding a "grand calling"? Why?
- 2. Read 1 Kings 17:2-4. God sends Elijah into the wilderness, that is, a place of hiddenness and separation. Why do you think Elijah needs to go to the wilderness? Why would God send him across the Jordan River?
- 3. Throughout Scripture, God often uses "wilderness experiences" to shape people. These can either be (a) chosen times of quiet hiddenness, like devotions, or (b) painful seasons of heartache and confusion.
  - Which kind of wilderness experience are you more familiar with: (a) or (b)?
  - Have you felt like these wilderness experiences shaped you? How so?
- 4. Read 1 Kings 17:5-6. Elijah being fed by ravens is pretty miraculous, to say the least.
  - Have you ever witnessed the power of God? If yes, what was that like?
  - If you feel like you haven't witnessed the power of God, what's your response when you hear stories from others?
- 5. Read 1 Kings 17:7. When Elijah went into the wilderness, he was dependent on God. When he came back, he was desperate. Have you ever experienced something similar? Share a time when you could sense that your dependence on God was growing.
