- 4. Discuss the following two statements about righteousness and what they mean for your life as a follower of Jesus.
 - a. God declares us righteous through our faith in Jesus.
 - b. Discipleship is entering into a lifelong journey with Jesus where we partner with God to become more like him.
- 5. Becoming like Jesus takes time, intentionality, and patience. What are some of the obstacles or challenges you experience in pursuing righteousness?
- 6. In Matthew 11:28-30, Jesus invites us to live the way of the easy yoke and light burden. How is this different from the common perception that following Jesus is all about rules and duty?
- 7. Every oak tree begins with a small acorn. What is one thing you can do this week to increase intentionality in your discipleship journey with lesus? Share that with the group.
